LECTURER IN EDUCATIONAL RESEARCH METHODOLOGY – INTRODUCTORY, INTEGRATIVE RESEARCH WITH EXPERTISE IN QUALITATIVE AND QUANTITATIVE APPROACHES. The Inquiry Program faculty of the School of Education at Indiana University, Counseling and Educational Psychology Department announces the opening of a lecturer position for an educational research methodologist with expertise in qualitative and quantitative approaches and a broad theoretical understanding of core methodological concepts (e.g., validity, generalizability, causal inference). Preference will be given to candidates who are able to forge dialogues across qualitative and quantitative areas of expertise and have a broad and critical understanding of inquiry methodologies (including understanding and appreciation of research strategies using qualitative data). Candidates with an identified substantive area of interest (e.g., program evaluation, policy analysis, cognitive/educational psychology) are preferred. The Lecturer will be expected to teach a 3-3 load of graduate courses predominantly focusing on introductory and advanced research methodology courses and to contribute across the full range of learning opportunities available to graduate students in the School of Education.
